- **Usage alerts**—Use your phone or computer to manage your power use. You can set up alerts to know when your energy use is approaching the threshold you choose. It lets you know if you need to turn the thermostat down an extra degree or two.
- **Virtual Energy Assessment**—This free digital tool, available from the co-op's website, allows you to track your electricity use and receive customized do-it-yourself

suggestions for using less power.

- **Button-Up program**—Through simple upgrades like air sealing and insulation, you can make your home more comfortable while saving energy and money on your electric bills. Qualified participants can earn a rebate, too.
- **Rebate programs**—Are you planning to replace your ceiling cable, baseboard or electric furnace heating with a new heat pump? They're much more efficient than older resistance heat. Check with us first to see how you can earn cash back in the form of a rebate.
- **Together We Save**—Tap into this digital library of energy-saving information offered by Kentucky's Touchstone Energy Cooperatives, including Fleming-Mason Energy. Visit TogetherWeSaveKY.com for ideas and tutorials.
- **Levelized billing**—If you sign up, no matter the weather outside, your bill won't be a surprise. It takes the guesswork out of your monthly energy bill.

Let's celebrate energy awareness

Americans have been recognizing October as National Energy Awareness Month since President George H.W. Bush first declared it in 1991. It's a time for shining a spotlight on energy efficiency, conservation and sustainability—something we do every day at Fleming-Mason Energy.

As a not-for-profit electric cooperative, we encourage members to conserve electricity. By lowering usage, you can lower your bills. Since every little bit helps when it comes to energy savings, celebrate National Energy Awareness Month with some quick and easy DIY projects. These tasks will help prepare your home for winter and contribute to its energy efficiency all year long.

- **Stop the leaks.** Reducing the amount of air that leaks in and out of your home is a cost-effective way to cut heating costs, which can account for almost half of the average wintertime electric bill. Caulking and weather stripping are two simple and effective air-sealing techniques that offer quick returns on investment, often after only a year or less.
- **Clean or replace filters.** Set a monthly reminder to inspect, clean or change air filters in your furnace or heat pump. A dirty filter can increase energy costs and damage your equipment.
- **Adjust fans.** The ceiling fans in your home are helpful if you use them wisely. During the winter, fans should turn in a clockwise direction to disperse heat that has risen toward the ceiling. Reverse fans to push cool air down during the summer.

Don't leave home without it

Assemble a winter emergency kit before inclement weather arrives

When the leaves start to turn, it's time to prepare for a wintertime road emergency. Take the time to make an emergency kit or replenish the one you may already have. A well-equipped emergency car kit is a simple way to ensure you're ready for anything, no matter where the road takes you.

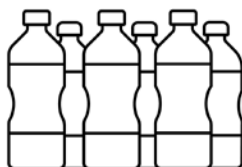
Dustin Skaggs, Fleming-Mason Energy's safety director, suggests packing your kit with items for warmth, visibility, traction and basic repairs as well as first aid.

10 ESSENTIAL ITEMS FOR YOUR CAR EMERGENCY KIT

- **First-aid kit** packed with adhesive bandages, antibiotic ointment, cotton swabs, hydrocortisone cream, latex or nitrile gloves, scissors, elastic bandages, antiseptic wipes, sterile gauze pads, instant cold pack, pain relievers and tweezers. You can buy a good first-aid kit at most drug stores, department stores or outdoors stores.
- **Emergency radio** to stay updated on emergency alerts and weather warnings when traditional communication channels are down.
- **Flashlight and extra batteries** for seeing and signaling for help during nighttime emergencies.
- **Jumper cables.**
- **Bottled water and nonperishable snacks** like granola bars or nonperishable trail mix.
- **Blankets and warm clothing,** including hand warmers to maintain body heat.
- **Tire repair kit and inflator** to temporarily fix a flat until you can get to a repair shop.
- **Road flares or reflective triangles** to alert motorists of your presence in low-visibility conditions.
- **Shovel and sand** to get tires unstuck during slippery conditions.
- **Portable power bank** for cell-phone charging.

EMERGENCY ESSENTIALS

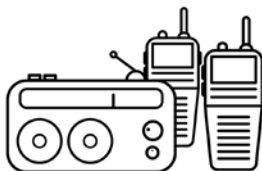
According to **Ready.gov**, a basic emergency supply kit should include the following items.



Water. At least one gallon of water per person per day for three days or more.



Food. At least three days' supply of non-perishable foods, such as canned goods and dry mixes.



Radio. Battery-powered radio or hand crank emergency radio with weather alert.



First aid kit. Includes gauze, bandages, antibiotic ointment, pain relievers, a blanket and non-latex gloves.
